

If you have recently moved to the area or if you are a long -time resident, please consider registering at the parish where you participate. There's usually information in a parish bulletin or in the pew racks about how to register. When in doubt, ask a priest after Mass. In most cases, you will need to visit the parish office and fill out a simple form or register online.

Top Reasons to Register at a Parish

- A sense of belonging and identity in a parish community.
- It is a commitment to practice your faith.
- Registration enables the parish pastor and staff to get to know you better, to welcome you and to minister to you. This is especially important during a time of crisis so that the pastoral staff can attend to your spiritual needs and the needs of your family.
- Registration helps you stay connected with your parish and helps your parish stay connected with you. Providing your contact information is important so that parishes provide you timely updates via email, direct mail, phone, etc. Also, if you use offertory envelopes or online giving, you will also receive a year-end statement of your donations for income tax purposes. Once you are registered, please notify the parish office of any changes in address or phone number.
- Registered active members are eligible for sponsor/godparent validation.
- Registered active members are sometimes eligible to rent parish facilities.
- Census numbers may determine how many priests are assigned to a parish and how many Masses and enrichment programs are planned and scheduled.



From the Pastor's Desk

Dear brothers and sisters,

Throughout the next few weeks, I will be inviting you to read and reflect on different letters and homilies from various saints. It is important as Catholics that our church know the life and thoughts of the Saints, since we are called to be saints. We will find in them a lot of wisdom and knowledge, but they will also be of great consolation to us.

Today I invite you to reflect on this paragraph from a Letter to the Ephesians by Saint Ignatius of Antioch, bishop and martyr (Nn. 2,2-5, 2: Funk 1, 175-177)

From a Letter to the Ephesians by Saint Ignatius of Antioch, bishop and martyr

(Nn. 2,2-5, 2: Funk 1, 175-177)

The harmony of unity

It is right for you to give glory in every way to Jesus Christ who has given glory to you; you must be made holy in all things by being united in perfect obedience, in submission to the bishop and the presbyters. I am not giving you orders as if I were a person of importance. Even if I am a prisoner for the name of Christ, I am not yet made perfect in Jesus Christ. I am now beginning to be a disciple and I am speaking to you as my fellow disciple. It is you who should be strengthening me by your faith, your encouragement, your patience, your serenity. But since love will not allow me to be silent about you, I am taking the opportunity to urge you to be united in conformity with the mind of God. For Jesus Christ, our life, without whom we cannot live, is the mind of the Father, just as the bishops, appointed over the whole earth, are in conformity with the mind of Jesus Christ. It is fitting, therefore, that you should be in agreement with the mind of the bishop as in fact you are. Your excellent presbyters, who are a credit to God, are as suited to the bishop as strings to a harp. So in your harmony of mind and heart the song you sing is Jesus Christ. Every one of you should form a choir, so that, in harmony of sound through harmony of hearts, and in unity taking the note from God, you may sing with one voice through Jesus Christ to the Father. If you do this, he will listen to you and see from your good works that you are members of his Son. It is then an advantage to you to live in perfect unity, so that at all times you may share in God. If in a short space of time I have become so close a friend of your bishop—in a friendship not based on nature but on spiritual grounds—how much more blessed do I judge you to be, for you are as united with him as the Church is to Jesus Christ, and Jesus Christ to the Father, so that all things are in harmony through unity. Let no one make any mistake: unless a person is within the sanctuary, he is deprived of God's bread. For if the prayer of one or two has such power, how much more has the prayer of the bishop and the whole Church.





A message from Pope Francis

Pope Francis called on catechists to "pray and think creatively about a catechesis centered on the *kerygma*, which looks to the future of our communities, so that they may be ever more rooted in the m Gospel, communities that are fraternal, and Inclusive." First, Pope Francis emphasized the relationship between catechesis and *Kerygma*, the proclamation of the Word of God. " Catechesis," he said, "is the echo of the Word of God." At the heart of the Kerygma is a Person, Jesus Christ; catechesis, therefore, "is privileged space for a personal encounter with Him." And so, the Pope said, catechesis "must be interwoven with personal relationships." Catechists are witnesses who have themselves encountered Jesus, and wish to lead others to encounter Him. Pope Francis emphasized, too, that catechesis must be given in the language of the people, "in dialect, that is the language that comes from the heart." To do so, he said, we must remember elements of catechesis that are most needed today: expressing God's saving love, appealing to freedom, marked by joy. Similarly, this demands "certain attitudes" on the part of catechists, including approachability, openness to dialogue, patience, warmth, and welcome.

The Pope's second point had to do with catechesis and the future. In 2020, the church in Italy marked the 50th anniversary of the "renewal of catechesis" following the Second Vatican Council. "The catechesis inspired by the Council," said Pope Francis, "is continually listening to the heart of the man, always with an attentive ear, always seeking to renew itself." Pope Francis insisted: "This is the Magisterium. The Council is the Magisterium of the Church. Either you are with the Church and therefore you follow the Council, and if you don't follow the Council or you interpret it in your own away, as you desire, you do not stand with the Church." He asked that there be "no concessions to those who seek to present a catechesis that does not agree with the Magisterium of the Church."

Finally, Pope Francis noted the importance of belonging to a community, especially in a year marked by isolation and a sense of loneliness. Community, he said, "is not an agglomeration of individuals, but the family into which we are integrated, the place where we take care of each other." **source: Christopher Wells, Vatican News**
